

CAMP HORIZON - CAMPS

Since 1965, Easter Seals Camp Horizon's mission has been to provide children, youth, and adults with disabilities and medical conditions with life-changing outdoor recreation experiences. Camp offers unique opportunities and activities for campers to build self-esteem and independence, while creating lasting friendships and life long memories.

FUELING OUR MISSION



At Easter Seals Alberta, we are committed to creating life-changing experiences for children and individuals with disabilities. One of the ways we make this possible is through our year-round Camp Horizon facility bookings and outdoor education programs, which help support our camps and other essential services.

While our summer camps are the heart of our mission, our work doesn't stop there. During the off-season, we open our facilities to community groups, schools, and organizations for weddings, events, retreats, and outdoor education programs. These bookings not only bring people together in a beautiful and accessible setting, but they also play a crucial role in supporting our mission.

129 Facility Bookings

The revenue generated from these events, in addition to support received from our generous donors, allows us to subsidize camper fees by almost 70%, making it possible for more families to send their children to camp—regardless of their financial situation.

Each event and booking made at our facilities has a direct and meaningful impact. From school groups benefiting from outdoor learning experiences to organizations hosting important events, these bookings provide the necessary funds that help ensure our programs remain affordable and accessible. These experiences also help sustain our camp and education programs, which, in turn, improve the lives of those we serve.

MCQUEEN HOME

The concept for Easter Seals Alberta's McQueen Home was recognized in 1972, to fill a gap in available group living options for people with disabilities.

Founded by Ruth Peterson, the home was created with the vision for her son Gerry, to have a place where young adults with disabilities could thrive and actively participate in their community.

In 1975, McQueen Home became a reality in Edmonton, marking Canada's first accessible home for adults with physical disabilities.

Today, McQueen Home is a nine-bedroom residence designed for individuals with high personal care needs requiring support to live independently. With 24/7 staffing, including a Licensed Practical Nurse and health care attendants, the home provides a safe and secure environment for residents with varying disabilities and medical conditions.

The dedicated staff ensure the house feels like a home and residents are encouraged to connect with their community through volunteering, attending courses, working part-time, and spending quality time with family and friends.

Residents enjoy activities around the house year round, including shared meals, playing board games and celebrating holidays. In 2024 the home welcomed family and friends for a Christmas celebration and their annual outdoor barbeque, fostering a vibrant and inclusive atmosphere.

The transition to adulthood for a young person with a disability can be a stressful and uncertain time for families. We are here to provide information, resources, and ongoing guidance to help families navigate this significant life change. Our goal is to ease the burden of these transitions, ensuring families feel confident and well-equipped to support their youth as they enter adulthood.



Guidance Through Guardianship & Trusteeship

For families supporting a young adult with a disability in Alberta, the process of navigating Guardianship & Trusteeship can be complex and daunting. Our team is here to help guide you through this process, offering support as you complete your application. We work to ensure families feel informed and prepared, providing peace of mind as they make decisions that will impact the future of their loved ones.



Independence and safety are key for individuals with disabilities, and our Equipment Loan Program makes it possible for Albertans to access long-term mobility equipment. This program offers wheelchairs, walkers, and other essential mobility aids to individuals who qualify both physically and financially. By providing this equipment, we help individuals live more independently and confidently, without the financial burden of purchasing the necessary tools for mobility.

The work we do is crucial because it ensures that families do not have to face these challenges alone. By offering expert guidance and connecting families with the right resources, we help reduce stress and improve access to vital support services. Ultimately, we are able to enhance the quality of life for individuals with disabilities, ensuring they receive the care, resources, and opportunities they deserve.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Easter Seals Alberta's scholarships provide crucial financial support to students with disabilities, empowering them to pursue higher education and achieve their career goals. These scholarships help reduce financial barriers, fostering greater accessibility and inclusivity in academic institutions.

By investing in the education of individuals with disabilities, we not only enhance personal growth and independence but also contribute to a more diverse and skilled workforce.

Maguire Family Scholarship

This gift was developed to provide financial support to students with disabilities who face significant barriers to accessing higher education. It has a focus on those in rural or underserved communities.



I am a counselling student currently in my undergrad degree. I am a childhood brain cancer survivor & due to the treatment I developed visual impairments that consider me under the spectrum of being legally blind, a hearing impairment causing me to need to use hearing equipment/tools, and a reading learning disorder.

The Maguire Scholarship allowed me to focus on my studies and that I did not have to overwhelm myself by trying to handle full time school & a job. With the support of the Maguire family I am able to pursue my passion for helping others," Mikayla.

Accessible Technology and Mentorship Program

Easter Seals partnered nationally with Scotiabank for Supporting Students through the Accessible Technology and Mentorship Program, which aims to bridge the gap that the cost of accessible accommodations, specialized technology, learning aids, attendant care, support services, and accessible transportation can create for students living with disabilities.



"While my disability affects my day to day life in regard to physical tasks, it has no impact on my cognitive abilities. School has always been a safe space for me because it can prove exactly what I'm capable of.

Norman Denoon Memorial Scholarship

Red Shirt Day


